

# Sackville School Careers Provision 2014-15



**Vision: At Sackville we aim to ensure all Sackville students receive effective careers guidance to allow them to make informed choices about their future.**

Sackville provides a comprehensive futures programme for all its students from the moment they arrive in Year 7 right up to the day they graduate and beyond.

Students are made aware of the opportunities that exist after Sackville as early as year 8, by taking part in the 'Real Game' a simulation of working life. Careers is a key part of the year 9 personal development curriculum and year 10 have three collapsed days through the year focusing on futures. In addition to this provision we hold our annual futures fair and a "meet the professionals" evening. A summary of our provision can be viewed in the table below:

In addition to the provision above, our careers advisor provides individual guidance to students. This is open to all students for self-referral, and is a focused intervention for our SEND students and those most at risk of not continuing in education, employment and training.

Our first generation scholars scheme ensures we are working with all families to ensure that our most able students, whatever their background, are given the opportunity to access higher education.

Work experience is open to all students. In most cases students are encouraged to organise this themselves, however in others it is used as a targeted intervention.

The success of this provision can be clearly seen in our destination data, where the number of Sackville students not continuing in education, employment and training, is well below the national average.
