I am writing a special edition of Sackville News today to share with you the **stunning government analysis of our 2015 exam results** released today.

Our 'value added' score this year was 1029, against a national average of 1000. This puts us in the top 12% of schools nationally – a fantastic achievement.

All this number crunching can seem quite abstract, but what 1029 actually means is that on average our year 11 students achieved a grade higher than they were expected to get in five of their GCSEs (including maths and English).



So imagine a student who was expected to get **10 Ds at GCSE**. At **Sackville** that student got **5 Cs and 5 Ds**. What a difference that makes to life chances!

Today is 'Stars in our Schools' day, when we celebrate the enormous contribution of our excellent support staff.

I know I speak for the whole community when I say that we would not have achieved our fantastic results without the effort, support and professionalism of this group of people.



Finally, I am really glad to say that the progress of all groups of students was above the national average, significantly so in almost every case, as you can see from all of the green in the picture below.
