Grade	Typical student behaviour
A	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> always punctual to lessons <input type="checkbox"/> always attentive when teacher or others are talking <input type="checkbox"/> always stays on task, working with a quiet but determined sense of purpose so that work is always completed to the best of the student's ability, broadly in line with target <input type="checkbox"/> always asks questions if in difficulty <input type="checkbox"/> always willing to answer questions during whole class teaching, frequently putting hand up
B	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> usually punctual to lessons <input type="checkbox"/> mostly attentive to teacher or peer talk <input type="checkbox"/> very rarely off task, so that work set is usually completed within time allocated and to the best of the student's ability <input type="checkbox"/> will question if in difficulty <input type="checkbox"/> prepared to answer questions and contribute to discussions
C	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> not always punctual to lessons <input type="checkbox"/> not always attentive to teacher or peer talk <input type="checkbox"/> can need reminding to stay on task, so that there are occasions when work could be completed more quickly, or to a higher standard <input type="checkbox"/> will sometimes question if in difficulty <input type="checkbox"/> will answer questions and contribute to discussions when asked by teacher, and will occasionally put up hand
D	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <input type="checkbox"/> can be late to lessons <input type="checkbox"/> can be inattentive to teacher or peer talk <input type="checkbox"/> often off task, so that work set is often not completed within time allocated, and is frequently below the standard expected <input type="checkbox"/> reluctant to question if in difficulty, preferring to idle <input type="checkbox"/> rarely prepared to answer questions or contribute to discussions
